




Metropolitan Cathedral of the Assumption of the Most Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven

This grand Roman Catholic Cathedral with many ornate chapels is Latin America's oldest & largest. Took a long time to build: 250 years from 1573 to 1813.

Initially, the planned construction was inspired by the gothic cathedrals of Spain but the long-time of construction led to the integration of multiple architectural styles: Baroque, Churrigueresque, Neoclassical.








The Cathedral, the Palace of Fine Arts, along with the rest of the buildings in the city, have been sinking into the lakebed from the day they were built.

This is due to the fact that Mexico City is a megalopolis with over 18 million people and drawing water from underground sources has caused water tables to drop and the sinking to accelerate during the latter half of the 20th century.

The problem was made even worse by the spongy soil and seismic activity.

Palace of Fine Arts

A splendid white-marble Palace located next to Alameda Central (Mexico City oldest municipal park).







Anaceh - "Palace of the Stuccos" contains many elaborate friezes, detailed carvings and restored stucco faces of Mayan deities. 22




































35 The ancient City is situated in the Rainforest in the National Park of Palenque. The Architecture is unique for its high degree of refinement, lightness and harmony.
